FROM SCHIPHOL AIRPORT TO KORZO

From Schiphol airport, you can easily get to The Hague by train (see the next page for more information). The train station is located directly below the terminal building, therefore, you need to take the escalator or lift downstairs to board the train. You can find the NS trains below the main entrance of the airport. Just follow the signs and you can't miss it.

There are two train stations in The Hague:

- Den Haag Centraal
- Den Haag HS

Den Haag Centraal


From the Den Haag Centraal station, you can take the tram number 17 (direction to *DH Statenkwartier*) from the *Den Haag, Centraal Station* to *Torenstraat*. From there is only a 3-minute walk to Korzo!

Another option is to go by foot. It takes around 20 minutes from the Den Haag Centraal to Korzo.

Den Haag HS

From the Den Haag HS station, you can take the tram number 17 (direction to *DH Statenkwartier*) from the *Holland Spoor station* to *Torenstraat*. From there is only a 3-minute walk to Korzo!

Another option is to take a walk through the city centre. It takes around 22 minutes from the HS station to Korzo by foot.



TRAVELLING BY TRAIN

The train network in the Netherlands is very efficient. Tickets can be bought through a ticket machine on all train stations (note that they cost 1 euro extra) or online by using the NS app. However, the easiest way is to use OVpay because you only need your credit or debit card. To get in the train, you need to pass a turnstile. Simply check-in by bringing your card to the small screen. Don't forget to repeat the same process when check-ing out! If there are no turnstiles on the train station (Schiphol airport), you need to find this device to check-in. If you have any troubles, the NS service point can always help you.

I forgot to check-in or out... what now?

It happens to the best of us! You can adjust missed check-ins or -outs on the OV self-service page. Please note you can only do so at least 5 days after your trip. You have a total of 60 days to adjust any missed check-ins or -outs.

GETTING AROUND THE HAGUE

Rike

The best way get around the city is by bike. You can cycle almost everywhere. You can rent one at the Central Station for & 4,15 a day.

ARRIVAL TO KORZO

When you come in to Korzo, it is necessary to check in at the front desk. You will write down your name and position (dancer, composer,...). Do not forget to sign out when you leave. With this easy system we have an overview of who is in the building each day.

Know your way

The Korzo building consists of a foyer, three stages, three studios, dressing rooms, kitchen and offices. The offices are located on the first floor where you can also find the kitchen and the dining area.

Opening hours

During the week 9:00 - 22:00 Saturday 10:00 - 18:00

Sundays only when it is required

Please note: The front of house is open until 15 minutes after the start of the performance. If it is desired that the front of house remains open longer, please contact the production manager.. Rehearsals starts at the earliest half an hour after opening and end at the latest half an hour before the front of house closes.

Studios

Nobel Studio – second floor to the right, size: 9.75 x 12.80 m.

Kerkstudio – second floor to the left, with original 18th century stained glass windows, size: 9.75 x 11.75 m.

Zolderstudio - third floor, at the back, size: 7,80 x 10 m.

If you need to store your belongings overnight use the lockers, do not leave anything in the studio as it will be removed by the maintenance personnel.

Lost and found is located in the hallway on the second floor, in between Nobel and Kerkstudio.

Living kitchen

The kitchen with a dining area on the first floor is open for use to all Korzo staff and visiting artists. Tea and coffee are on the house. Please put your dishes in a dishwasher after use and do not forget to empty the dishwasher when it's done. We would like to ask you to label your food in the fridge (your name and date). Make sure to not leave it after the expiry date... mold is not welcomed in the house!

In the kitchen you will find: a fridge and freezer, gas stove, oven, microwave and a grill.

Internet/Wifi password

The environment

At Korzo we do our best to think about the environment. Therefore, we would like to ask you to take care of:

Dishwasher

In the kitchen there is a dishwasher. When the dishes are clean please empty the dishwasher so there is place for new dishes. Please put the dishwasher basket out of the dishwasher, and close the dishwasher. This way the dishwasher stays warm and doesn't have to warm-up again. Dry the dishes from the basket, put them back where they belong and put the dishwasher basket back in the dishwasher.

Recycling Center

In the hallway between the kitchen and the offices you can find a recycling center. At the moment at Korzo we recycle:

- Plastic
- Paper
- Deposit bottles (also the little ones of 0,5 liter are deposit)

Lights

Please turn off the lights of all the rooms when you leave.



You will be staying at a distance of a two minute walk from Korzo







Call the Algemene Spoedgevallendienst (General Emergency Service) on (070) 311 03 05, Monday through Thursday from 16.00, Friday from 12.00, and in the weekend. They will tell you which dentist is available to see you.

Another option is the dental practice 'Praktijk op de Burgemeester Hovylaan'. They are open 24/7. The costs of the emergency consultation are between € 150 - €250.

SHOPPING

Supermarkets

Albert Heijn & Albert Heijn TO GO

Don't fall into the first tourist trap in Holland – Albert Heijn TO GO is present at most train stations and on busy high-street corners. The prices can be higher up to three times the price of the same product in a regular Albert Heijn supermarket. You can easily recognize them by the 'to go' logo and by its smaller size and lack of alleys. While AH 'to go' is a good solution for late hours, it is definitely NOT the place where you want to do your regular groceries.

Jumbo & Jumbo City

Just like Albert Heijn & Albert Heijn TO GO, you do also have a Jumbo & Jumbo City. The Jumbo City is smaller, has less products and three times expensive as a regular Jumbo. It is definitely NOT the place where you want to do your regular groceries.

Outdoor organic market (near Binnenhof)

Every Wednesday the organic market will take place at the city centre of The Hague (walking distance from Korzo) at the Hofplaats. All the products are organic: vegetables, fruit, cheese and also local specialties such as satéh.

The market is open every Wednesday 08.00 - 18.00.

De Haagse Markt

The Haagse Markt is located along the Herman Costerstraat between Hobbemaplein or Hoefkade. The easiest way to get there is to take tram 11 or 12 from the train station Den Haag Holland Spoor, get off at Hobbemaplein or Hoefkade.

The Market is opened every Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday 09.00 - 17.00. Saturday is the best (and busiest) day to visit for fresh fruit and vegetables.

You can also buy flowers, nuts and all kinds of other stuff.

General shopping

The most common areas for shopping are De Passage (the oldest indoor shopping center of the Netherlands, now valued UNESCO monument) and the commercial streets, Grotemarkstraat and Wagenstraat.

ABOUT THE HAGUE

There are about 203 000 trees in The Hague, 400km of bicycle paths, 11km of coastline, 27 000 students, 30 theatres, 26 cinemas, 4292 shops, 98 embassies, 12 consulates, 490 restaurants, over 300 cafes and as of 2023 the population is around 560 000. The Hague is the country's third biggest city. It was founded in the 13th century and is known as the City of Peace and Justice.

CULTURE IN THE HAGUE

Museums

The Hague has some 30 top-quality museums and can rightly be seen as a city full of art and culture. Some enjoy a worldwide reputation while others are less well known, which only adds to their charm. You can find a complete list here:

The museums we recommend to visit:

Kunstmuseum Den Haag - is one of the most important museums in the world of modern art. The museum's permanent collection contains not only works by Mondrian, but also works by Picasso, Appel and Klee as well as the Dutch landscapes of the Hague School paintings. In addition, the Kunstmuseum organizes dozens of top-notch expositions each year on modern art, decorative art and fashion.

The Royal Picture Gallery Mauritshuis - is housed in one of Holland's most outstanding classicist buildings next to the Binnenhof. While the Mauritshuis is mainly known for its Dutch Golden Age paintings, including the Girl with a Pearl Earring, there is much more to see. How about a wonderful overview of Dutch and Flemish painting from the 15th to the 18th century? From Flemish primitive art to sun-drenched landscapes, from Biblical figures to detailed still-lives and from serene interiors to humorous genre pieces.

Amare - a new theatre which has opened its doors in 2021. Amare wants to boost connection and anchoring in the city of The Hague. They are committed to reaching diverse communities with quality offerings through education, performances, projects, festivals and programming in the public areas of the building. Amare brings dance, music, music theater and community art of an international level to a wide audience. Amare's partners are the permanent residents: the Residentie Orkest, Nederlands Dans Theater and the Royal Conservatoire.

SIGHTSEEING

Binnenhof - This one is hard to miss! The oldest part of the medieval earl's castle, the Knights' Hall and the 'Rolgebouw' behind it date from the 13th century. In the course of the centuries, the Binnenhof was renovated and expanded continuously. As early as the 15th century the Binnenhof housed the County Council and in 1585 it became the seat of the States General of the Republic of the Seven United Netherlands. An exhibition has been opened in the reception area underneath the Ridderzaal (Knights' Hall) dedicated to Dutch parliamentary history.



The Peace Palace - is a home to a number of international judicial institutions, including the International Court of Justice, or World Court, the Permanent Court of Arbitration, the renowned Peace Palace Library, as well as the Hague Academy of International Law, which attracts law students from all over the world every summer. Accessible to the public through guided tours.

Garden of the Noord-Einde Palace - Noordeinde Palace has been the palace of the Royal House since 1609 when the state presented it to William of Orange's widow as a gift. Today, the Dutch monarch uses it as a working palace. The palace itself is not open to the public, but the street that leads to it (Noordeinde) is well-known for having the highest density of art in Holland. The gardens are open to the public daily and can be reached at the end of Prinsestraat (Korzo is at number 42). Just next to the park you'll see the Royal Stables where the horses and coaches of the Royal House are kept. The garden is a perfect spot for lunch during a sunny day!

Keukenhof garden

What is Holland known for apart from cheese and weed? Tulips of course. If you are here in April or May you may want to visit the biggest tulip garden in Europe - Keukenhof in Lisse, which is an hour bus ride from The Hague. Just be mindful that the tickets are quite expensive and it is always full of tourist.
